PITTSBURGH RIVERHOUNDS SC'S DANNY GRIFFIN PASSES 15,000 MINUTE LANDMARK

Pittsburgh Riverhounds SC's **Danny Griffin** became the 57th player to pass 15,000 regular season minutes in the USL Championship on Saturday, going the full 90 minutes in the Hounds' 3-2 victory against Loudoun United FC at Segra Field. In doing so, Griffin became only the fourth player in league history to record at least 15,000 minutes for a single club.

Griffin joins a club that also includes former teammate and current Hounds assistant **Kenardo Forbes**, who logged 15,490 regular season minutes for Pittsburgh in his career. Current Louisville City FC center back Sean Totsch (21,577 minutes) and former Charleston Battery standout Taylor Mueller (16,567 minutes) currently sit 1-2 in the league's all-time list.

DANNY CRUZ DEPARTS LOUISVILLE CITY AS USL CHAMPIONSHIP GROUNDBREAKER

Louisville City FC announced on Tuesday the departure of Head Coach Danny Cruz to pursue a new opportunity in professional soccer. It ended the five-year tenure of one of the most successful managers in USL Championship history, with the 36-year-old having achieved numerous landmarks individually and in guiding Louisville City as a club since his appointment on April 27, 2021.

EL PASO LOCOMOTIVE FC'S RUBIO RUBÍN FLYING IN SMALL-SAMPLE SIZE ALL-STARS

El Paso Locomotive FC forward **Rubio Rubín** recorded his third goal in two games to start the 2026 season on Saturday night in the club's 3-0 victory against Monterey Bay FC. The fast start has continued the Guatemala international's remarkable record in the USL Championship regular season which has seen him record 12 goals in 23 appearances across prior stints with San Diego Loyal SC and the Charleston Battery.

Overall, Rubín has averaged a goal every 95.9 minutes in the USL Championship regular season, which puts him second in strike rate in a diverse cast of small sample-size stars that have recorded at least 10 goals in the league over their career. The all-time leader in the category is former Orlando City SC and Oakland Roots SC forward **Dom Dwyer**, whose 16 goals in the league's regular season came at a strike rate of a goal every 89.6 minutes.

LOUISVILLE CITY FC REACHES TOP FIVE IN HOME REGULAR SEASON UNDEFEATED STREAKS

Louisville City FC earned a 4-1 victory against Miami FC in its home opener on Saturday afternoon at Lynn Family Stadium as the trio of **Chris Donovan**, **Ray Serrano** and **Jansen Wilson** each recorded a goal and

assist. The victory saw Louisville extend its home undefeated streak in the USL Championship regular season to 25 games, tied for the fourth-longest streak in league history.

Louisville is chasing the 33-game home undefeated streak set by the **Richmond Kickers** across the 2012-14 seasons, during which time the Kickers went 22-0-11 and claimed the 2013 USL Championship Players' Shield. LouCity's current streak has seen the side go 22-0-3, with its target game to equal the mark in its contest against Birmingham Legion FC on Wednesday, July 29.

Quick Hits

- **Oakland Roots SC's** 2-1 victory against New Mexico United on Saturday night marked the first time the club had started a season 2-0-0 since joining the USL Championship ahead of the 2021 season.

- **Pittsburgh Riverhounds SC's** 3-2 victory against Loudoun United FC on Saturday marked the club's first victory after conceding the opening goal since a 4-2 victory against Memphis 901 FC on July 29, 2023.

- **Detroit City FC's** victory against Brooklyn FC on Saturday afternoon marked its 50th regular season win since joining the USL Championship ahead of the 2022 season. Le Rouge have gone 50-42-41 in the regular season over the past four-plus campaigns.
