TAMPA BAY'S RUSSELL CICERONE JOINS 70-GOAL CLUB, NEARS 100 GOALS CONTRIBUTIONS

Tampa Bay Rowdies forward **Russell Cicerone** had a strong home debut at Al Lang Stadium on Saturday night, recording a goal and assist in his side's 3-0 victory against Pittsburgh Riverhounds SC. The 31-year-old forward's tally moved him to 70 regular season goals in the USL Championship, making him only the 11th player to reach that mark in the league's history, reaching the landmark in his 234th regular season appearance.

Cicerone's assist also moved him to 29 regular season assists and 99 regular season goal contributions for his career, a mark previously accomplished by only 10 players in league history. Cicerone has averaged a goal contribution every 174.8 minutes across his regular season career in the USL Championship.

CHARLESTON'S BEN PIRMANN, HARTFORD'S BRENDAN BURKE ONE WIN FROM CENTURY

The Charleston Battery's **Ben Pirmann** and Hartford Athletic's **Brendan Burke** maintained their club's respective undefeated starts to the season this past Saturday as the Battery rallied for a 3-2 win against Birmingham Legion FC and Athletic earned a 2-1 road victory against Brooklyn FC. The wins moved both Pirmann and Burke to 99 career coaching wins in the USL Championship across the regular season and playoffs for their respective careers.

The 2022 USL Championship Coach of the Year, Pirmann has posted a 99-43-38 record during his tenures at Memphis 901 FC and the Charleston Battery. The 40-year-old would become both the second-youngest

manager to reach the mark in the league's history but also potentially the second-fastest to reach the mark after former Louisville City Head Coach **Danny Cruz**. Pirmann has coached 180 games in the USL-C, while current Sacramento Republic FC Head Coach **Neill Collins** reached the century mark in his 185th game.

Burke has posted a record of 99-109-63 during his career in the Championship, which began leading Bethlehem Steel FC in the 2016 season as the reserve team of the Philadelphia Union. Leading independent clubs in the USL-C at Colorado Springs Switchbacks FC and Hartford Athletic, the 43-year-old has posted a 59-50-29 record across the regular season and places, good for eighth-most victories in the league among coaches this decade.

LOUISVILLE CITY APPROACHES 200 VICTORIES MARK

Louisville City FC took a 4-2 victory against Rhode Island FC on Saturday night at Lynn Family Stadium to earn the club's third consecutive win to start the season. It also moved LouCity to 199 regular season victories in the league, with Saturday's contest against Brooklyn FC offering the opportunity to become the first club to record 200 regular season wins in league history.

Louisville City has reached the mark in 341 regular season contests, posting a 199-67-75 record since joining the USL Championship prior to the 2015 season. Only the Charleston Battery are within 20 victories of LouCity, sitting at 192 wins with a record of 192-133-116 as one of the league's founding members in 2011.

LouCity's victory against Rhode Island also extended its current home regular season undefeated streak to 26 games. The club now sits in sole possession of fourth in the league's history, passing the 25-game streaks set by Orlando City SC (2011-13) and Pittsburgh Riverhounds SC (2018-20).

Louisville is chasing the 33-game home undefeated streak set by the **Richmond Kickers** across the 2012-14 seasons, during which time the Kickers went 22-0-11 and claimed the 2013 USL Championship Players' Shield. LouCity's current streak has seen the side go 23-0-3, with its target game to equal the mark its contest against Birmingham Legion FC on Wednesday, July 29.

LOUDOUN UNITED'S ADAM BEAUDRY JOINS 10-SAVE SHUTOUT CLUB

Loudoun United FC goalkeeper **Adam Beaudry** recorded a 10-save shutout in his debut for the club on loan from the Colorado Rapids on Saturday night, earning United a scoreless draw against Miami FC at Segra Field. In turn, the 19-year-old became only the 14th goalkeeper to record a double-digit saves shutout in the USL Championship, and the first to do so for Loudoun.

Beaudry was the second-youngest goalkeeper to achieve the feat at 19 years, 337 days old. He trailed only current New York City FC goalkeeper **Tomás Romero**, who was 18 years, 213 days old when he posted an 11-save shutout for the Philadelphia Union II in a 1-0 victory against Louisville City FC on July 20, 2019.

USL CHAMPIONSHIP PLAYERS SET FOR WORLD CUP QUALIFYING, AFC ASIAN CUP QUALIFYING

Twenty-three players from the USL Championship are set for international duty this week, with Tampa Bay Rowdies goalkeeper **Jahmali Waite** and Louisville City FC midfielder **Kevon Lambert** hoping to lead Jamaica into its first FIFA World Cup since 1998 as the country competes in the Intercontinental Playoff in Mexico.

Jamaica will face New Caledonia on Thursday night (11 p.m. ET | FS1 & Peacock) for the chance to advance to face the Democratic Republic of the Congo next Tuesday for a place in this summer's World Cup.

Also in competitive action is New Mexico United's Zico Bailey, who will try to help the Philippines qualify for the 2027 AFC Asian Cup. The Philippines faces Tajikistan next Tuesday with Bailey and his teammates needing victory to advance to the AFC Asian Cup for just the second time in the country's history.

Quick Hits

- The **Charleston Battery** set a new season-high for shots in a game this season with 28 shots against **Birmingham Legion FC** in its 3-2 comeback victory at Patriots Point. The combined 40 shots between the Battery and Legion were joined in logging the most combined shots in a game this season by **Indy Eleven** and **Detroit City FC** on Saturday night at Michael A. Carroll Stadium.
- Sacramento Republic FC's **Danny Vitiello** posted his seventh penalty kick save in the USL Championship regular season on Saturday night against Monterey Bay FC, moving to 7 of 22 for his career facing penalties. Vitiello is now only one penalty save from equaling the league's all-time record of eight stops held by **Jeff Caldwell**, who saved 8 of 20 penalty kicks he faced during his career.
- San Antonio FC's **Mitchell Taintor** moved into the top five in league history in regular season minutes as he reached 22,248 minutes for his career, passing former Pittsburgh Riverhounds SC star Kenardo Forbes. Four of the top five players in minutes played are currently active in the league, with No. 1 **Sean Totsch** (24,420), No. 2 **Aodhan Quinn** (24,378) and No. 4 **Phanuel Kavita** (22,594) also in the group.
- Tampa Bay Rowdies forward **Evan Conway**'s late goal against Pittsburgh Riverhounds SC saw him extend his scoring streak to four consecutive regular season appearances. Conway found the net in each of his final three regular season appearances for North Carolina FC to conclude the 2025 season.
- San Antonio FC defender **Danny Barbir**'s game-winning goal in his side's 1-0 victory against New Mexico United was his first goal in the USL Championship since September 23, 2023 when he scored for Oakland Roots SC against Monterey Bay FC. Barbir has seven career goals in the league overall.
- The Charleston Battery's **Miguel Berry** equaled this season's single-game high with nine shots against Birmingham Legion FC on Saturday night at Patriots Point. Rhode Island FC's **Leo Afonso** also recorded nine shots in his side's contest against Sporting Club Jacksonville on March 14.
