LOUISVILLE CITY REACHES 200 REGULAR SEASON VICTORIES MARK

Louisville City FC earned its 200th regular season victory in the USL Championship on Saturday night with a 1-0 win against Brooklyn FC at Maimonides Park, becoming the first team in league history to reach the landmark. LouCity reached the mark in its 342 regular season contests, posting a 200-67-75 record since joining the USL Championship prior to the 2015 season.

Over the duration of Louisville City's history in the USL Championship from the start of the 2015 season, it is 47 victories ahead of second-placed **Phoenix Rising FC** (153-108-80), while also leading the league with 642 goals, an average of 1.88 per game.

LouCity's 200 wins have come at a 58.3 percent clip across all games, a mark that sits second to only **Orlando City SC** (65.6%) among clubs that have recorded at least 50 regular season contests in the USL Championship over their history. Overall, only four teams currently sit with a winning percentage above 50 percent all-time, with the **Tampa Bay Rowdies** in fifth at 49.1 percent.

NEW MEXICO UNITED MAINTAINS HOME HEX OVER SWITCHBACKS

New Mexico United's dramatic 3-2 victory against Colorado Springs Switchbacks FC at Isotopes Park on Saturday afternoon extended United's home undefeated streak in the series between the Western Conference clubs to eight games. New Mexico has now won seven of eight meetings between the clubs at Isotopes Park in USL Championship play, tied for the third-most meetings without a defeat at home among active series.

San Antonio FC holds the mark for the most home games without defeat in an active series at 12, also against the Switchbacks, having gone 10-0-2 at Toyota Field in meetings between the clubs all-time.

Louisville City FC could equal that mark this Saturday as it hosts the Charleston Battery having gone 11 games undefeated in their prior meetings across the regular season and playoffs.

LOUCITY, ROWDIES PURSUE SEASON-OPENING WINNING STREAK MARK

Six teams concluded the first month of the regular season with undefeated records, while Louisville City FC (4-0-0) and the Tampa Bay Rowdies (3-0-0) emerged with perfect records. Their marks put both within reach of the longest winning streak to start a USL Championship season of six games, set in the league's inaugural 2011 campaign by the Richmond Kickers and then equaled the following year by the Rochester Rhinos.

The Rowdies' three-game winning streak to start the season is their best since a five-game winning streak to open the 2021 campaign, which marked the season Tampa Bay claimed the Players' Shield for the first time. LouCity has equaled its longest winning streak to start a season, previously achieved in both the 2018 and 2024 seasons.

ALBERT DIKWA GETS BACK INTO SWING WITH HOUNDS

2023 USL Championship Golden Boot winner Albert Dikwa has hit the ground running upon his second stint with Pittsburgh Riverhounds SC, scoring three goals in four appearances to sit second in the early race for the Golden Boot. The Cameroonian striker notched a brace in the club's home opener on Saturday against Sporting Club Jacksonville to move to 59 regular season goals for his career and 39 in the USL Championship regular season for Pittsburgh.

Dikwa's 39 goals for the Hounds have featured eight two-goal displays, with Saturday's performance moving him into a tie for fourth in two-goal games for an individual club. Former Louisville City FC standout Cam Lancaster leads the all-time list, putting up 12 braces for LouCity in the USL Championship regular season.

NEW MEXICO UNITED FEATURES LATE-GAME DRAMA AGAIN

New Mexico United claimed a dramatic 3-2 victory against Colorado Springs Switchbacks FC on Saturday afternoon at Isotopes Park as **Ousman Jabang** scored in the sixth minute of second-half stoppage time to earn the hosts all three points in their home opener.

The goal marked the ninth time New Mexico United has scored a game-winning goal in the USL Championship regular season in second-half stoppage time – defined as from the 90:01 mark in Opta – since joining the league for the 2019 season. That ranks second to only **Birmingham Legion FC**, which has scored 10 game-winning goals in second-half stoppage time since its arrival in the same campaign.

Quick Hits

- New Mexico United's **Dayonn Harris** became the first player in club history to record a goal and assist off the bench in the USL Championship regular season or playoffs as he helped lead the side's 3-2 victory against Colorado Springs Switchbacks FC. Harris is the third player this season to record a goal and assist off as a substitute, following Hartford Athletic's **Samuel Careaga** (at JAX, 3/7) and the Tampa Bay Rowdies' **MD Myers** (vs. PIT, 3/21).

- **Miami FC's** 4-2 victory against Sporting Club Jacksonville marked the first time the side had rallied to claim victory on the road after trailing at halftime since October 7, 2023 against the Charleston Battery.

- Sporting Club Jacksonville's **Kieran Sadlier** scored the fastest goal in the USL Championship so far this season after 91 seconds against Miami FC at Hodges Stadium on March 28.

- Lexington SC's Aaron Molloy recorded his 10th regular season goal from outside the penalty area with his game-winning goal against Brooklyn FC at Lexington SC Stadium on March 28.

- Tampa Bay Rowdies forward **Evan Conway** has recorded a goal contribution in his past five appearances in the USL Championship, recording four goals and one assist dating back to the end of the 2025 season with North Carolina FC.

- **Mataeo Bunbury's** first goal for Orange County SC was also his first goal in the USL Championship since finding the net for Birmingham Legion FC against Loudoun United FC on July 27, 2022.

- **Las Vegas Lights FC** and **Monterey Bay FC's** contest on Saturday at Cashman Field marked only the fourth time in a USL Championship regular season game that teams had combined to convert only one penalty kick out of three in a game.

- **San Antonio FC's** four-game undefeated streak to start the season is the club's longest undefeated run in league play since it won four consecutive games to start the 2025 regular season.
