TAMPA BAY'S RUSSELL CICERONE REACHES 100 REGULAR SEASON GOAL CONTRIBUTIONS

Tampa Bay Rowdies forward **Russell Cicerone** scored his second goal of the season on Saturday night against Oakland Roots SC and moved to 100 goal contributions in the USL Championship for his career. The 30-year-old has recorded 71 goals and 29 assists in 237 regular season appearances and became the 11th player in league history to reach the mark.

Cicerone will join an elite club in the USL Championship's history with his next assist, with only current Charlotte Independence forward **Enzo Martinez** (78G, 53A) and former Charlotte Independence star **Jorge Herrera** (72G, 35A) having reached both 70 goals and 30 assists in their regular season careers.

LOUISVILLE CITY'S BRANDON DAYES SCORES FIRST PROFESSIONAL GOAL

Louisville City FC's **Brandon Dayes** recorded his first goal in the professional ranks on Friday night in the side's 3-3 draw against Loudoun United FC at Segra Field, becoming both the second-youngest goalscorer in LouCity history and the second-youngest player to find the net in the USL Championship this season.

Scoring his first goal at the age of 17 years, 114 days old, Dayes ranks second in LouCity history to **Joshua Wynder**, who was 17 years, 62 days old when he bagged his first USL Championship goal for the club against Birmingham Legion FC on July 2, 2022. Dayes also ranks second to Orange County SC's Tyson Espy in this year's crop of young talent, with Espy's first professional goal coming aged 16 years, 352 days old against Colorado Springs Switchbacks FC on March 21.

LAS VEGAS LIGHTS' GUILLÉN, LOUDOUN UNITED'S AKINYODE BAG RARE GOALS

Las Vegas Lights FC defender **Aarón Guillén** scored his side's goal in a 1-1 draw against Sacramento Republic FC on Saturday night, marking just his third goal in the USL Championship regular season all-time, while Loudoun United FC's **Bolu Akinyode** scored his first goal for United on Friday night in a 3-3 draw against Louisville City FC, marking just his sixth goal in the USL Championship regular season all-time.

With their respective goals, the two veterans remain tied for the fewest goal contributions in the USL Championship by a player with more than 200 regular season appearances, with Guillén (3G, 5A) and Akinyode (6G, 2A) each having eight over their respective careers.

Quick Hits

- Indy Eleven's **Jack Blake** became the club's all-time leading scorer with his goal against Monterey Bay FC on Saturday night, giving him 28 goals across all competitions for the Boys in Blue. The goal was also Blake's 25th regular season goal for Indy since his arrival at the club for the 2023 season.

- Sacramento Republic FC midfielder **Mark-Anthony Kaye**'s goal against Las Vegas Lights FC marked his first in the USL Championship since October 14, 2017 for Louisville City FC against the Richmond Kickers, a span of 3,101 days between goals.
- **El Paso Locomotive FC**'s 4-0 victory against Hartford Athletic at Trinity Health Stadium on Saturday night marked the 77th instance of a road team winning by a four-goal margin or greater in the USL Championship's regular season. It equaled Locomotive's largest road victory in league play having previously defeated Real Monarchs SLC 4-0 on October 4, 2020.
- **Louisville City FC**'s 3-3 draw against Loudoun United FC at Segra Field last Friday night marked the first time LouCity had conceded at least three goals in the USL Championship regular season since a 6-4 victory against North Carolina FC on August 31, 2024.
- **El Paso Locomotive FC**'s current four-game winning streak is its longest in USL Championship play since a seven-game winning streak between April 9-June 4, 2023, while its 13 points in the first five games is the best five-game start in club history, surpassing a mark of 11 points (3-0-2) in five games to start the 2021 season.
- **Miami FC**'s current five-game undefeated streak is its longest in USL Championship play since an eight-game undefeated streak between Aug. 14-Oct. 2, 2022. The club's longest undefeated streak in the regular season is nine games between Aug. 1-Sept. 18, 2021.
- **Indy Eleven**'s victory against Monterey Bay FC on Saturday night was its 99th regular season win since joining the USL Championship for the 2018 season. Indy is 99-97-57 in the Championship's regular season all-time.
