#### **RHODE ISLAND FC'S JJ WILLIAMS JOINS 50 GOALS, 25 ASSISTS CLUB**

Rhode Island FC forward JJ Williams became the 34<sup>th</sup> player to record 50 regular season goals in the USL Championship's history with his two-goal game against the Charleston Battery on April 29. The 28-year-old reached the mark in his 167<sup>th</sup> regular season appearance in the Championship, with his 14 goals for RIFC the most Williams has recorded for one club having previously reached double figures for Birmingham Legion FC and the Tampa Bay Rowdies.

Williams is also the 13<sup>th</sup> player to reach at least 50 goals and 25 assists in the USL Championship's regular season, having recorded 29 regular season assists in his career. That puts him in an exclusive and varied group of strikers and playmakers in the league's history.

### **OAKLAND ROOTS' PETER WILSON BAGS FIRST HAT TRICK OF SEASON**

Oakland Roots SC forward **Peter Wilson** recorded the first hat trick of the 2026 USL Championship season last Wednesday night in his side's 4-2 victory against Las Vegas Lights FC, with the three goals the first this season for the 2025 USL Championship Golden Boot winner.

Wilson became the 106<sup>th</sup> player to record a hat trick in the Championship's regular season all-time, and the first to do so for Oakland since it joined the USL Championship in the 2021 season. Previously, Roots players had recorded 15 two-goal performances in USL Championship, with **Johnny Rodriguez** and **Ottar Magnus Karlsson** tied for the team-high with four apiece.

### **CHARLESTON BATTERY CONTINUE STREAK VS. LOUDOUN UNITED FC**

The **Charleston Battery** took a 2-1 victory against **Loudoun United FC** on Saturday night in Group 6 of the 2026 Prinx Tires USL Cup as **Graham Smith** scored a stoppage-time winner. The result extended the Battery's undefeated streak in official USL Competition to 13 games (9-0-4) against Loudoun, with United's lone victory in the series coming on Oct. 13, 2019.

The Battery's streak is now two shy of the longest undefeated streak in a series between two USL Championship clubs across regular season, postseason and USL Cup play. The longest such streak is a 15-game undefeated streak by **San Antonio FC** against **Colorado Springs Switchbacks FC** which ran between Oct. 20, 2019 and June 26, 2025, with the Switchbacks ending the run with a 1-0 win on Oct. 4, 2025.

The Battery's victory also saw the side move to seven games without defeat at Loudoun United in its history, going 4-0-3 in its travels to Segra Field across the USL Championship and USL Cup play. That mark is second among active series without an away loss, with **Louisville City FC** having not lost in 12 visits to **Pittsburgh Riverhounds SC** across the regular season and playoffs since the beginning of the series in 2015.

#### **INDY ELEVEN'S BRUNO RENDÓN FIRST TO DOUBLE-DIGIT GOALS IN USL CUP**

Indy Eleven forward **Bruno Rendón** became the first player to record 10 goals in the Prinx Tires USL Cup with his late tally against Union Omaha on Saturday night in the opening round of games in Group 4. The Cuban forward's finish was his first in the competition for the Boys in Blue, with Rendón having previously recorded nine goals in eight appearances for Northern Colorado Hailstorm FC in the inaugural edition of the tournament in 2024.
