HARTFORD ATHLETIC'S ADRIÁN DIZ PE'S JOINS OWN GOAL, GAME-WINNING GOAL CLUB

Hartford Athletic defender **Adrián Diz Pe** had one of the unique outings in the USL Championship's regular season on Saturday night as he became the 11th player to record both a goal and an own goal in the same contest in Hartford's 2-1 victory against Detroit City FC. The Cuban veteran scored an own goal in the 84th minute to bring the game level before scoring the game-winner five minutes later.

Diz Pe is the fourth player to record the game-winning goal in the same game as an own goal, most recently accomplished by Monterey Bay FC's **Alex Lara** against Memphis 901 FC on April 20, 2024. Lara scored an own goal in the opening minute of the game before scoring the winner in a 2-1 victory with 20 minutes to play.

COLORADO SPRINGS' KHORI BENNETT SUCCESSFUL ON THE SPOT

Colorado Springs Switchbacks FC's Khorri Bennett recorded his seventh goal of the season on Friday night in the club's 2-2 draw against Orange County SC, with his tally in first-half stoppage time his fifth penalty kick goal of the current campaign. Bennett is now 9 of 9 from the penalty spot in the USL Championship regular season for his career, placing him tied for third in league history for the most penalty kicks taken without a miss.

HARTFORD ATHLETIC'S BRENDAN BURKE EARNS 100TH VICTORY IN USL CHAMPIONSHIP

Hartford Athletic Head Coach **Brendan Burke** earned his 100th victory in the USL Championship on Saturday night as Hartford took a 2-1 victory against Detroit City FC at Trinity Health Stadium. The 43-year-old is the seventh manager to reach the mark in the USL Championship's history, doing so in his 276th game across the regular season and playoffs.

Burke ranks as the third-most experienced manager in the USL Championship's history with prior stints at the Philadelphia Union II (2015-2019) and Colorado Springs Switchbacks FC (2021-22) before being appointed Hartford's Head Coach prior to the 2024 season. During his stints with the Switchbacks and Hartford, Burke has posted a record of 60-51-32, ranking eighth among USL Championship managers from the start of the 2021 season, while leading Hartford to victory in the USL Cup in 2025.

PITTSBURGH RIVERHOUNDS SC CONTINUES ROAD SUCCESS AT LOUISVILLE CITY FC

Pittsburgh Riverhounds SC took a 2-0 victory against Louisville City FC on Saturday night at Lynn Family Stadium, recording its sixth road victory against LouCity in the regular season in the series between the clubs. Pittsburgh is now 6-3-2 on the road at Louisville all-time, with the Hounds' six victories accounting for 20.7 percent of Louisville's 29 home regular season defeats in its history.

The Hounds' victory also marked the 39th time since the start of the 2017 season a side has claimed victory in the USL Championship regular season while recording four shots or fewer. Both of LouCity's defeats at home this season to Pittsburgh and the **Charleston Battery** on April 4 have seen the visiting side record four shots.

Quick Hits

- New Mexico United forward **Greg Hurst**'s two-goal game against El Paso Locomotive FC on May 6 moved the Scottish forward to 25 regular season goals for the club. Hurst is now the second-leading regular season goalscorer in United's history, trailing only **Chris Wehan** on 35 regular season goals.
- Lexington SC's **Nick Firmino** recorded a two-goal game for the side in its 3-1 victory against Monterey Bay FC on Friday night, marking the first multi-goal game by a Lexington player in the USL Championship regular season since the club joined the league for the 2025 campaign.
- The **Tampa Bay Rowdies** are on a 10-game undefeated streak dating to the end of the 2025 regular season following the club's 1-1 draw against Rhode Island FC. The streak is the club's longest since an 11-game undefeated streak between April 29-July 9, 2023.

- **Oakland Roots SC** recorded 121 final third entries in its 2-1 victory against El Paso Locomotive FC on Saturday night at the Oakland Alameda Coliseum, marking the second-highest total in a regular season game on record since the start of the 2017 USL Championship season. **Pittsburgh Riverhounds SC** recorded 134 final-third entries against Indy Eleven on August 15, 2020 at F.N.B. Stadium.

- **Louisville City FC's** defeat to Pittsburgh Riverhounds SC marked the first time the side had suffered consecutive defeats in the USL Championship regular season since a three-game losing streak between July 12-22, 2023.

- Detroit City FC's **Devon Amoo-Mensah** passed 10,000 regular season minutes in the USL Championship this past Saturday against Hartford Athletic. Amoo-Mensah is the first player to log 10,000 regular season minutes in the Championship for DCFC, and the 41st player to log 10,000 regular season minutes for a single club in the league's history.

- Rhode Island FC's **JJ Williams** has recorded four goals and two assists in three appearances against the Tampa Bay Rowdies since he was acquired by RIFC from Tampa Bay via transfer prior to the 2024 USL Championship season.

- **Indy Eleven's** 2-1 victory against Sporting Club Jacksonville marked the club's 100th regular season win since the club joined the USL Championship ahead of the 2018 season. Indy is the 12th club to reach 100 regular season wins in the league's history.

- **Sporting Club Jacksonville's** losing streak reached seven games with the club's 2-1 defeat against Indy Eleven on Saturday night at Michael A. Carroll Stadium. Jacksonville would move into a tie for the sixth-longest losing streak in league history with defeat in its next league contest against San Antonio FC on Wednesday, May 27.
