TEENAGE TRIO ADD NAMES TO USL CUP YOUNGEST GOALSCORERS LIST

Orange County SC's **Jamir Johnson**, Phoenix Rising FC's **Eziah Ramirez** and the Charleston Battery's **Colton Swan** became the third, fourth and fifth teenagers to score in Prinx Tires USL Cup history on Saturday night on a notable night in the young tournament's history.

Johnson became only the second 17-year-old to find the net in the tournament, scoring his first goal for Orange County aged 17 years, 313 days old against Phoenix Rising FC to sit second in the all-time list behind current OCSC teammate **Pedro Guimaraes** (17 years, 71 days).

Rising's Ramirez ranked third in USL Cup history following his first goal in the professional ranks against OCSC, bagging the game-winner in Rising's 2-1 victory aged 18 years, 77 days old. Ramirez is the second-youngest goalscorer in the club's history, trailing only teammate **Anthony Capetillo**, who was 16 years, 142 days old when he scored in the U.S. Open Cup earlier this year against San Ramon FC. With his tally, Ramirez became Rising's youngest scorer in official USL competition, surpassing the mark set a season ago by **Pierce Rizzo**, who was 18 years, 249 days old when he scored against the Tampa Bay Rowdies on Aug. 16, 2025.

Swan became the fourth-youngest player to find the net in the USL Cup with his first-half goal against the Richmond Kickers at City Stadium coming aged 19 years, 13 days old. The United States U-20 international has now scored in all three competitions the Battery have competed in this season.

LOUCITY'S DONOVAN, WILSON RECORD DOUBLE-BRACE AS SUBSTITUTES

Louisville City FC forwards **Jansen Wilson** and **Chris Donovan** made Prinix Tires USL Cup history on Sunday afternoon as each player recorded a pair of goals after coming on as a substitute in the club's 5-1 victory against Union Omaha at Morrison Stadium, becoming the first teammates in the tournament's history to record braces as substitutes in the same game.

Wilson entered the game as a first-half substitute for **Zach Duncan** in the 23rd minute and proceeded to strike in the 27th and 49th minutes to put Louisville into the lead twice. Donovan then entered in the 64th minute for **Tola Showunmi** and helped LouCity wrap up the result, scoring in the 72nd and 83rd minute. Wilson and Donovan joined current teammate Jake Morris in achieving the feat, with Morris having struck twice after coming on as a substitute in last year's group stage contest against Lexington SC.

Additionally, **Sam Gleadle** became the first player to record two assists as a substitute in Prinix Tires USL Cup history after entering in the 64th minute, providing the helpers on LouCity's final two goals by Donovan and Quenzi Huerman in the 83rd and 87th minutes.

COLORADO SPRINGS' LACROIX, EL PASO'S CARL SAINTÉ NAMED IN HAITI WORLD CUP SQUAD

Colorado Springs Switchbacks FC's **Duke Lacroix** and El Paso Locomotive FC's **Carl Sainté** have been named in Haiti's squad for the upcoming 2026 FIFA World Cup. The two players were included in Les Grenadiers' squad announcement last Friday, becoming the first active USL Championship players to be selected to compete at the FIFA World Cup.

Lacroix has made 229 appearances across the USL Championship and USL Cup in his career, recording 10 goals and 20 assists while helping the Switchbacks claim the 2024 USL Championship title. Sainté has recorded 37 appearances in the USL Championship and USL Cup over his career, recording one goal, having also spent time with FC Dallas following his transfer from New Mexico United in the 2022 season.

MIAMI FC'S ELOY ROOM, JÜRGEN LOCADIA NAMED IN CURAÇAO WORLD CUP SQUAD

Miami FC's **Eloy Room** and **Jürgen Locadia** have been named in Curacao's squad for the upcoming 2026 FIFA World Cup. The two players were included in the Blue Wave's squad announcement on Monday, becoming the third and fourth active USL Championship players to be selected to compete at the FIFA World Cup.

Both Room and Locadia joined Miami FC this preseason and have been regulars for the side across the USL Championship and USL Cup play. Locadia has recorded two goals and two assists in 10 appearances across the two competitions, while Room has recorded 22 saves and four shutouts in nine appearances across the two competitions.

- Hartford Athletic goalkeeper **Antony Siah** recorded his fifth shutout in the Prinx Tires USL Cup for his career in the side's 2-0 win against Brooklyn FC on Saturday night, moving into a tie for the all-time tournament lead with current Athletic Club Boise goalkeeper **Jared Mazzola**.
- Sacramento Republic FC winger **Mayele Malango**'s game-winning goal against Oakland Roots SC in the Prinx Tires USL Cup was his fifth goal all-time in the competition, making him the ninth player to reach that mark in the tournament's young history.
- **Louisville City FC**'s 5-1 victory against Union Omaha on Sunday evening equaled the most goals scored in a Prinx Tires USL Cup contest, joining **Phoenix Rising FC** (5-4 at Texoma FC, 6/28/25) and **Northern Colorado Hailstorm FC** (5-1 vs. One Knoxville SC, 5/10/24) in recording a five-goal game in the competition.
- The **Tampa Bay Rowdies** are undefeated in their last 10 meetings across USL Championship and USL Cup play against **Miami FC** following their 4-1 victory on Saturday night at Pitbull Stadium. Miami last claimed victory in the series with a 1-0 win on April 9, 2022 at Al Lang Stadium.
- The **Charleston Battery**'s 4-0 victory against the Richmond Kickers in the Prinx Tires USL Cup marked their first away win at City Stadium since September 16, 2016 in the USL Championship.
