FC TULSA'S ALEX TAMBAKIS REACHES 60 CAREER REGULAR SEASON SHUTOUTS

FC Tulsa goalkeeper **Alex Tambakis** posted a five-save shutout in his side's 2-0 victory against Hartford Athletic last Friday night at ONEOK Field and in turn became the second goalkeeper in USL Championship history to reach 60 regular season shutouts. The Greek shot-stopper – who stands as the league's all-time leader with 673 regular season saves – reached the mark in his 243rd regular season appearance. He ranks second to Sacramento Republic FC's **Danny Vitiello** in regular season shutouts.

SACRAMENTO REPUBLIC FC'S DANNY VITIELLO SURPASSES 400 CAREER SAVES

Sacramento Republic FC goalkeeper Danny Vitiello recorded a four-save performance in his side's contest against San Antonio FC on Saturday night at Toyota Field to surpass 400 career regular season saves in the USL Championship. The current all-time leader with 61 regular season shutouts, Vitiello reached the mark in his 158th regular season appearance and is the fifth player to surpass the landmark in league history.

FC TULSA CLAIMS RARE VICTORY WITH FEWER THAN 100 COMPLETED PASSES

FC Tulsa claimed a 2-0 victory against Hartford Athletic on Friday night at ONEOK Field while recording its fewest passes completed in a victory in club history, with the Scissortails completing only 89 passes and posting a 50% passing accuracy rate while holding just 31 percent of possession. The performance marked the seventh occasion on record in the USL Championship across the regular season and playoffs that a side had claimed victory with fewer than 100 completed passes.

The all-time fewest passes completed in a victory in USL Championship history is by **San Antonio FC**, which completed only 84 passes in the 2022 USL Championship Final as it took a 3-1 victory against Louisville City FC. Four of the seven instances of a side winning with fewer than 100 completed passes were achieved by that same 2022 San Antonio team.

SPORTING CLUB JACKSONVILLE APPROACHING LONGEST WINLESS START

Sporting Club Jacksonville enters Week 13 looking for its first win in the USL Championship having earned one point from its opening nine games in the club's regular season history. The mark is one result away from equaling the longest winless run to start a club's history in the USL Championship, with **Hartford Athletic** having gone 10 games without a victory to open its inaugural 2019 campaign.

INDY ELEVEN'S AODHAN QUINN SET FOR DOUBLE-MILESTONE OUTING

Indy Eleven veteran **Aodhan Quinn** could reach a pair of notable landmarks on Saturday night when Indy Eleven hosts Rhode Island FC at Michael A. Carroll Stadium with the versatile 34-year-old set to reach both 300 regular season appearances and 25,000 regular season minutes for his career in the USL Championship.

Quinn enters the contest with 299 regular season appearances and 24,978 regular season minutes. He would become the first player in league history to surpass the 25,000 minutes mark while joining Louisville City FC's **Sean Totsch** in reaching 300 regular season appearances.

Quick Hits

- Oakland Roots SC forward **Peter Wilson** has scored in four consecutive regular season contests, scoring six goals in that span, following his second-half goal against Orange County SC on Saturday night at Santa Ana Stadium.
- The **Tampa Bay Rowdies'** 12-game undefeated streak dating to the end of the 2025 regular season is the club's longest since a 13-game streak between May 16-Aug. 7, 2022.
- The Tampa Bay Rowdies' **Pedro Dolabella** scored after just 70 seconds against Phoenix Rising FC on Saturday night, marking the fastest goal in the USL Championship so far this season.
- Miami FC forward **Jürgen Locadia's** hat trick against Louisville City FC was the second by a Miami player since the club joined the USL Championship in the 2020 season. **Joaquín Rivas** previously recorded a hat trick for the club against Hartford Athletic on Aug. 19, 2023. It marked just the second hat trick scored against Louisville City in its history following **Enzo Martínez's** hat trick for the Charlotte Independence on Aug. 5, 2017.
- Lexington SC defender **Javain Brown's** red card after 144 seconds was the earliest in the USL Championship this season. The earliest red card in league history remains **Paul Nicholson's** sending off after 14 seconds for Wilmington Hammerheads FC against Orange County SC on April 26, 2013.
- The Tampa Bay Rowdies' **Lewis Hilton** recorded his 150th regular season appearance for the club in its 3-0 victory against Phoenix Rising FC on Saturday night. Hilton joins **Leo Fernandes** (173) and **Aarón Guillén** (171) in recording at least 150 regular season appearances for Tampa Bay since its arrival in the USL Championship in 2017.
- **Las Vegas Lights FC's** victory against Colorado Springs Switchbacks FC broke a 10-game winless run in the series between the clubs with the Lights last having defeated the Switchbacks on Sept. 28, 2019.
