BIRMINGHAM LEGION'S RONALDO DAMUS REACHES 50-GOAL LANDMARK

Birmingham Legion FC's **Ronaldo Damus** became the 35th player to reach 50 regular season goals in the USL Championship on Saturday night as he bagged the third goal in Legion's 3-1 victory against Rhode Island FC at Centreville Bank Stadium.

Damus reached the mark in his 124th regular season appearance, with the 2021 USL Championship Final MVP having averaged a goal every 185.3 minutes in his tenure in the league, good for the 12th-best strike rate in the league among players with at least 50 regular season goals.

TAMPA BAY ROWDIES' RUSSELL CICERONE RECORDS 30TH REGULAR SEASON ASSIST

The Tampa Bay Rowdies' **Russell Cicerone** recorded his 30th regular season assist in the USL Championship on Saturday night, providing the helper on **Matheus Oliveira**'s game-winning goal in the side's 1-0 victory against Indy Eleven at Al Lang Stadium.

The assist continued what has been a landmark-filled start to the season for Cicerone, who had previously notched his 70th regular season goal and reached 100 goal contributions for his career this season. The 31-year-old is now only the third player in the USL Championship's history to record at least 70 goals and 30 assists, joining current Charlotte Independence **Enzo Martínez** (78G, 53A) and retired standout **Jorge Herrera** (72 goals, 35 assists) in reaching the mark.

PHOENIX RISING FC'S JAETHAN IRWIN BECOMES YOUNGEST OUTFIELD STARTER IN USL CHAMPIONSHIP

Phoenix Rising FC midfielder **Jaethan Irwin** recorded his first start in the USL Championship on Saturday night against Pittsburgh Riverhounds SC at F.N.B. Stadium aged 15 years, 104 days old, becoming the youngest outfield player to start a game in the league's history. Irwin surpassed the mark of **Alfonso Ocampo-Chavez**, who was 15 years, 105 days old when he made his first start for Tacoma Defiance against Real Monarchs SLC on July, 8, 2017.

The lone player to start a game at a younger age than Irwin is current Monterey Bay FC goalkeeper **Fernando Delgado**, who was 15 years, 82 days old when he made his debut for Real Monarchs SLC against Austin Bold FC on October 15, 2021.

SAN ANTONIO FC'S JORGE HERNÁNDEZ REACHES 75 GOAL CONTRIBUTIONS IN CHAMPIONSHIP

San Antonio FC's **Jorge Hernández** recorded a pair of goals in his side's 3-3 draw against Colorado Springs Switchbacks FC on Saturday night for just the second brace of his career in the USL Championship, moving to 37 career regular season goals in the league. The performance also moved Hernández to 75 goal contributions for his career in the USL Championship, becoming the 36th player to do so in the league's history.

Hernández reached the mark aged 25 years, 175 days old, making him the second-youngest player to reach the landmark in the USL Championship's history. Only former Louisville City FC standout **Wilson Harris** reached the landmark at a younger age, doing so aged 24 years, 333 days old in his final season at LouCity.

- The Tampa Bay Rowdies' **Jahmali Waite** became the 28th goalkeeper to reach 30 shutouts in the USL Championship's regular season with his four-save performance against Indy Eleven on Saturday night at Al Lang Stadium. The Jamaican international reached the mark in his 101st regular season appearance.

- **Sacramento Republic FC's** 3-2 victory against Orange County SC on Saturday night at Heart Health Park marked the first time Republic FC had claimed victory after trailing at halftime since a 2-1 victory against Monterey Bay FC on June 25, 2022.

- The Charleston Battery's **Colton Swan** recorded his first two-goal game in the USL Championship against Sporting Club Jacksonville on Saturday night aged 18 years, 364 days old. He is the second-youngest player to record a brace for the Battery in the Championship, trailing only **Fidel Barajas** (17 years, 171 days), and the first teenager to record a brace in the USL Championship since former Orange County SC winger **Bryce Jamison** on June 15, 2024 against Colorado Springs Switchbacks FC.

- The **Tampa Bay Rowdies** are on a nine-game undefeated streak dating to a 3-2 victory against Hartford Athletic on October 18, 2025, the longest undefeated run for the club since an 11-game streak between April 29-July 8, 2023.

- Sacramento Republic FC's **Danny Vitiello** recorded his seventh penalty save in the USL Championship regular season with his stop against Orange County SC's Lyam MacKinnon on Saturday night. Vitiello now ranks second in penalty saves in league history, trailing **Jeff Caldwell** on eight penalty saves for his career.

- **Sporting Club Jacksonville's** scoreless streak is currently at 388 minutes following the club's 4-0 defeat to the Charleston Battery on Saturday night, with the club's last league goal coming against Pittsburgh Riverhounds SC on March 28. The side has not recorded a shot on target in its last three league contests.
