DETROIT CITY'S DARREN SMITH BAGS SECOND FIVE-GOAL GAME IN USL CHAMPIONSHIP HISTORY

Detroit City FC forward **Darren Smith** became the second player to record a five-goal game in the USL Championship regular season this past Saturday night, scoring Le Rouge's opening five goals in a 6-2 victory against Sporting Club Jacksonville at Hodges Stadium. Smith equaled the single-game scoring mark previously achieved by **Mauricio Salles** for VSI Tampa Bay FC against Antigua Barracuda FC on June 8, 2013.

Smith is the 14th player to record at least four goals in a game in the USL Championship regular season, and the third to do so this decade following current Canada Men's National Team forward **Tani Oluwaseyi** for San Antonio FC on July 29, 2023 against Hartford Athletic and former Charleston Battery forward **Nick Markanich** against Las Vegas Lights FC on April 27, 2024. Of the players to record at least four goals in a single game in the USL Championship regular season, three have claimed the Golden Boot at the end of the season.

RHODE ISLAND FC'S JJ WILLIAMS JOINS 50 GOALS, 30 ASSISTS CLUB

Rhode Island FC forward **JJ Williams** recorded one goal and two assists in his side's 4-1 victory against Loudoun United FC on Saturday night at Segra Field, passing 30 career regular season assists for his career in the USL Championship. The 28-year-old is now the ninth player to have recorded at least 50 goals and 30 assists in the league's regular season, reaching the mark in his 172nd regular season contest.

SACRAMENTO REPUBLIC FC'S DANNY VITIELLO SETS NEW SINGLE-CLUB SHUTOUT MARK

Sacramento Republic FC goalkeeper Danny Vitiello recorded a two-save shutout in the club's 1-0 victory against Colorado Springs Switchbacks FC on Saturday night at Weidner Field. In turn, the 30-year-old recorded his 48th regular season shutout in Republic FC's colors, the most by a goalkeeper for a single club in the USL Championship's history.

Vitiello broke a tie with former Birmingham Legion FC goalkeeper **Matt VanOekel**, who recorded 47 of his 50 career shutouts in the Championship with Legion before his retirement this past offseason. Only three goalkeepers have recorded at least 40 regular season shutouts for one club, with the third being former Charleston Battery goalkeeper **Odisnel Cooper**.

SPORTING CLUB JACKSONVILLE'S WINLESS STREAK REACHES 13 GAMES

Sporting Club Jacksonville suffered defeats to Monterey Bay FC last Wednesday and Detroit City FC this past Saturday to see the club's winless run to start the USL Championship campaign to 13 games. Sporting JAX's run is now the fourth-longest winless streak to start a USL Championship regular season campaign, and the longest this decade.

Antigua Barracuda FC's 26-game winless streak in the 2013 season remains the longest to start a season in league history, while in the 2018 season both **Toronto FC II** (18 games) and **FC Tulsa** (15 games) made extended runs without a win to begin the campaign.

Quick Hits

- The **Charleston Battery's** home regular season undefeated streak reached 20 games with its 5-1 victory against FC Tulsa on Saturday night, going 17-0-3 with a +39 goal differential in that span. The streak ranks second for the club in the USL Championship era, trailing only a 28-game streak between May 24, 2014 and May 14, 2016.

- **Hartford Athletic's** 1-0 victory against the **Tampa Bay Rowdies** on Saturday night marked the club's first win in the series since July 14, 2021, breaking a run of 10 consecutive games without a win for Hartford against Tampa Bay.

- The Charleston Battery's **Wilmer Cabrera** became only the third player in the club's USL Championship era to record a goal and assist as a substitute in his side's victory against FC Tulsa, and the first since **Ricky Garbanzo** against the Charlotte Independence on Sept. 21, 2017.

- Hartford Athletic's **Antony Siah** and the Charleston Battery's **Luis Zamudio** each reached 100 regular season saves for their current clubs on Saturday night. The two shot-stoppers are the seventh and eighth

goalkeepers to record at least 100 saves for two clubs in the league, with Zamudio doing so previously for Loudoun United FC and Siahia for Monterey Bay FC.

- The **Tampa Bay Rowdies'** 14-game regular season undefeated streak dating to the end of the 2025 regular season was the club's longest since joining the USL Championship in the 2017 season, surpassing a 13-game streak to open the 2019 season.

- **Monterey Bay FC's** three-game winning streak has equaled the club's longest in the 2025 season between March 16-30, 2025. The club has twice previously recorded a four-game winning streak, most recently between Aug. 26-Sept. 16, 2023.

- **FC Tulsa's** 5-1 loss to the Charleston Battery marked the first time the Scissortails had lost after scoring the opening goal of the game since Oct. 19, 2024 against Hartford Athletic. It also marked the first time the side had conceded five goals in a league game under Head Coach **Luke Spencer**.
