INDY ELEVEN'S AODHAN QUINN FIRST TO PASS 25,000 MINUTE MILESTONE

Indy Eleven defender **Aodhan Quinn** became the first player in USL Championship history to pass 25,000 regular season minutes on Saturday night while also becoming the second player to record 300 regular season appearances in the league in Indy's 1-0 victory against Rhode Island FC.

Making his debut in the 2014 season for Orlando City SC, Quinn has been one of the most consistent performers in the Championship during his career, averaging 83.6 minutes per appearance. The 34-year-old also recorded his 64th career assist against RIFC, putting him two behind all-time leader **Kenardo Forbes**, and sits third in the league's all-time goal contributions list with 121 combined goals and assists.

TAMPA BAY ROWDIES CONTINUE UNDEFEATED STREAK TO START SEASON

The **Tampa Bay Rowdies** extended their undefeated streak to start the USL Championship regular season to 11 games with a 2-0 win against Louisville City FC on Saturday night at Lynn Family Stadium. The result gave the Rowdies 27 points from their first 11 games with an 8-0-3 record, marking one of the best 11-game starts to a season in league history.

Tampa Bay's start is the best by points since the club joined the USL Championship in 2017 and ranks tied for third for the most points through 11 games in a regular season campaign. The top two in the list both occurred in the 2017 season, when **Real Monarchs SLC** began its season with 30pts (10-1-0) while **San Antonio FC** recorded 29pts (9-0-2).

PITTSBURGH RIVERHOUNDS SC'S ALBERT DIKWA PASSES 50 GOAL CONTRIBUTIONS FOR CLUB

Pittsburgh Riverhounds SC's **Albert Dikwa** recorded a goal and assist in the Hounds' 2-0 victory against Miami FC on Saturday night at F.N.B. Stadium to reach 50 goal contributions for the club in the USL Championship regular season. The 2023 Golden Boot winner reached the mark in his 91st regular season game for the Hounds, becoming the 18th player to record at least 50 goal contributions for a single club in the USL Championship's history.

Dikwa has now recorded 42 goals and nine assists in Pittsburgh's colors and joined **Kenardo Forbes** (18G, 52A) and **Kevin Kerr** (29G, 25A) in reaching the landmark for the Hounds. The all-time leader in goal contributions for a single club in the USL Championship is **Solomon Asanté**, who recorded 49 goals and 41 assists in 103 appearances for Phoenix Rising FC across four seasons.

USL CHAMPIONSHIP, LEAGUE ONE, LEAGUE TWO REPRESENTED AT 2026 FIFA WORLD CUP

The USL Championship will be represented for the first time at the 2026 FIFA World Cup by four active players, but the Championship, League One and League Two will also be represented by 31 alumni competing for their countries at the competition.

The **United States Men's National Team** features the highest representation with 11 players who have featured across all three leagues named in Head Coach **Mauricio Pochettino's** squad. **Canada's** squad features eight players, and four players in **New Zealand's** squad round out the top three.

Quick Hits

- **Sporting Club Jacksonville** and **San Antonio FC** played to a 4-4 draw last Wednesday night, equaling the highest-scoring draw in the USL Championship's regular season. The contest was the 12th to end in a 4-4 scoreline in league history, following three games to end in that scoreline a season ago.

- Lexington SC's **Marcus Epps** recorded his 40th regular season goal in the USL Championship on Saturday night in his club's 4-1 victory against El Paso Locomotive FC. Epps is the 61st player to reach the mark in league history, and the 19th player to record at least 40 goals and 25 assists in the league's regular season.

- The **Charleston Battery** are on a 19-game home undefeated streak in the USL Championship regular season following their 2-0 victory against Detroit City FC on Saturday night. The Battery previously set the record for the longest home undefeated streak of 33 games between the 2012-14 seasons.

- **Phoenix Rising FC's** 10 shots on target against Sacramento Republic FC marked the first time the side had reached double-digit shots on goal in a regular season contest since September 21, 2024 against San Antonio FC, while its 3.77 Expected Goals mark was its highest since recording a 4.39xG mark against the New York Red Bulls II on October 1, 2022.

- **FC Tulsa** remained undefeated in its history against Las Vegas Lights FC following its 0-0 draw on Saturday night at Cashman Field. The Scissortails are 4-0-7 against the Lights all-time, marking the fifth-longest undefeated streak to start a series in the league's history. The record stands at 14 games, recorded by **Sacramento Republic FC** against FC Tulsa (9-0-5) prior to the Scissortails' first win in the series last year.

- Lexington SC's **Aaron Molloy** recorded his 30th regular season assist in the USL Championship during LSC's 4-1 victory against El Paso Locomotive FC. Molloy reached the mark in his 148th regular season appearance and has now recorded goal contributions in Lexington's past four regular season games (2G, 2A).

- Sacramento Republic FC's **Jack Gurr** became the 43rd player to record at least 10,000 regular season minutes for a single club in the USL Championship's history on Saturday night against Phoenix Rising FC. Gurr is the fourth player to reach the landmark in Republic FC's history, joining **Cameron Iwasa** (11,313), **Danny Vitiello** (11,160) and **Luis Felipe Fernandes** (10,610).

- **Louisville City FC** has lost four consecutive regular season contests for the first time in its history following its 2-0 defeat to the Tampa Bay Rowdies on Saturday night.
