TWO-GAME WEEK COULD SEE TAMPA BAY ROWDIES ACHIEVE NOTABLE UNDEFEATED RUN

The **Tampa Bay Rowdies** took a 2-0 victory against Sporting Club Jacksonville on Saturday night to clinch top spot in Group 7 of the Prinx Tires USL Cup at Hodges Stadium and in turn extended the club's undefeated streak across all competitions to 14 games to start the current season. The Rowdies are now 11-0-3 overall this season as they enter a two-game week at home to the **Charleston Battery** (Wednesday, 7 p.m. ET) and **Hartford Athletic** (Saturday, 7:30 p.m. ET).

Should the Rowdies end the week undefeated, the club would equal the longest undefeated streak to start a USL Championship season across all competitions. Previously, the 2014 **Orlando City SC** side and 2017 **San Antonio FC** side went 16 games undefeated across all competitions before falling for the first time. The Lions' first loss came in a 5-2 setback on June 17 in the U.S. Open Cup against the **Colorado Rapids**, while San Antonio's streak stretched to June 24 before the side fell 1-0 away in league play against **Colorado Springs Switchbacks FC**.

LOUISVILLE CITY'S SEAN TOTSCH BECOMES SECOND TO 25,000 REGULAR SEASON MINUTES

Louisville City FC defender **Sean Totsch** became the second player to reach 25,000 regular season minutes in the USL Championship last Wednesday night as he went the full 90 minutes in LouCity's 1-1 draw against Birmingham Legion FC at Protective Stadium. Totsch joins current Indy Eleven defender **Aodhan Quinn** in reaching the landmark, doing so in his league-leading 310th regular season appearance.

The 34-year-old is currently in his 10th season with Louisville City FC, during which time Totsch has become the all-time leader in minutes for a single club in USL Championship history. A three-time league title-winner, Totsch's 22,252 regular season minutes for Louisville are almost 6,000 minutes ahead of former Charleston Battery defender **Taylor Mueller**, who ranks second all-time.

HARTFORD ATHLETIC REACHES 10-GAME UNDEFEATED STREAK IN PRINX TIRES USL CUP

Hartford Athletic moved into first place in Group 5 of the Prinx Tires USL Cup on Saturday night with a 4-1 victory against the New York Cosmos at Hinchliffe Stadium. The victory extended the 2025 USL Cup winner's undefeated streak in the competition to 10 games, equaling the longest undefeated run in the competition's short history.

Athletic has posted a 7-0-3 record across the USL Cup group and knockout stage, equaling the mark of 2024 title-winner **Northern Colorado Hailstorm FC** when it claimed the inaugural edition of the tournament. Hartford will attempt to advance to the knockout stage for a second consecutive tournament on Saturday, July 11 when it hosts Westchester SC at Trinity Health Stadium.

LEXINGTON'S OLIVER SEMMLE EQUALS RECORD WITH THREE-SAVE SHOOTOUT

Lexington SC's **Oliver Semmle** helped lift his side to a 3-1 victory in a penalty shootout on Saturday night as LSC took the bonus point after a 1-1 draw against Detroit City FC in Group 4 of the Prinx Tires USL Cup at Keyworth Stadium. Semmle was the fifth goalkeeper to record at least three penalty kick saves in a USL Cup shootout all-time, and the second this year after **Johan Garibay** of One Knoxville SC on April 25.
