HARTFORD ATHLETIC'S MICHEE NGALINA JOINS USL CHAMPIONSHIP'S 40-30 CLUB

Hartford Athletic's **Michee Ngalina** helped his side rally to a 2-2 draw last Wednesday night against Orange County SC, recording a second-half assist on **Barry Coffey**'s second goal of the game. In turn, Ngalina recorded his 30th regular season assist and 75th regular season goal contribution in the USL Championship.

With 45 goals and 30 assists, Ngalina is the 15th player to record at least 40 goals and 30 assists in the USL Championship's regular season all-time. He is the youngest player to join the group, doing so aged 26 years, 93 days old.

PHOENIX RISING'S JAETHAN IRWIN BECOMES YOUNGEST TO RECORD ASSIST IN USL CUP

Phoenix Rising FC's **Jaethan Irwin** recorded his first assist in official competition on Saturday night in the club's Prinx Tires USL Cup contest against AV ALTA FC, being credited with the helper on **Gunnar Studenhofft**'s second-half goal. In turn, Irwin became the youngest player to record an assist in the USL Cup's history, doing so aged 15 years, 174 days old.

Irwin is also the second-youngest player to record an assist in official USL competition across the USL Championship, USL League One and USL Cup, trailing only 2018 USL Championship Young Player of the Year and current Chivas de Guadalajara star **Efraín Álvarez**, who recorded his first assist aged 15 years, 110 days old for the LA Galaxy II on October 7, 2017.

ORANGE COUNTY SC BECOMES FIRST TEAM TO 300 AWAY GOALS IN REGULAR SEASON

Orange County SC played to a 2-2 draw with Hartford Athletic last Wednesday at Trinity Health Stadium in the USL Championship, and in turn became the first club to pass 300 away goals in the league's regular season history. One of the league's founding clubs, OCSC has recorded 301 away goals in 229 games, ranking second to **Louisville City FC** in away wins with 78 in the league's regular season.

HARTFORD ATHLETIC SETS RECORD FOR UNDEFEATED STREAK IN PRINX TIRES USL CUP

Hartford Athletic advanced to the knockout stage of the Prinx Tires USL Cup for a second consecutive edition on Saturday night with a 2-1 victory against Westchester SC that placed it top of Group 5. In doing so, Hartford set a new USL Cup record as it extended its undefeated streak in the competition to 11 games.

Athletic has now posted an 8-0-3 record across the USL Cup group and knockout stage, surpassing the 10-game streak of 2024 title-winner **Northern Colorado Hailstorm FC** when it claimed the inaugural edition of the tournament. Hartford will aim to extend its streak against the **Charlotte Independence** in the Quarterfinals on Wednesday, Aug. 12, with the Independence sitting on the third-longest undefeated streak in the competition following its draw against the Charleston Battery that extended its streak to eight games.

OBREGÓN, TUNBRIDGE, WILSON MOVE INTO TOP FIVE IN USL CUP GOALSCORING

Brooklyn FC's **Juan Carlos Obregón Jr.**, Miami FC's **Mason Tunbridge** and Louisville City FC's **Jansen Wilson** each moved into the top five in Prinx Tires USL Cup goalscoring history with their tallies this past Saturday in the final round of group stage action. Obregón and Tunbridge each sit tied for second all-time on seven goals following their goals against Rhode Island FC and Sarasota Paradise respectively, while Wilson's two-goal performance against Lexington SC moved him into a tie for fifth with six goals in the competition.

- Sacramento Republic FC's **Mark-Anthony Kaye's** two assists against Rhode Island FC last Wednesday marked his first assist in the USL Championship since September 9, 2017, for Louisville City FC, and his first two-assist game in the league in his career.

- Orange County SC's **Nicola Ciotta** became only the 23rd teenager to record two assists in a USL Championship regular season game with his two helpers against Hartford Athletic last Wednesday night aged 19 years, 352 days old. He is also the youngest player to record two assists in a regular season game in Orange County's history.

- Hartford Athletic's **Barry Coffey** recorded the club's first two-goal game this season in Hartford's 2-2 draw against Orange County SC, becoming only the third substitute to record a two-goal performance in a regular season game for Athletic in its history.

- **Orange County SC's** seven-game undefeated streak in USL Championship regular season play is its longest regular season undefeated run since a 10-game streak between Sept. 14, 2024 and March 15, 2025.

- Rhode Island FC's **Agustín "Pity" Rodríguez** became RIFC's youngest goalscorer in official USL competition with his first goal for the club against Brooklyn FC on Saturday night in the Prinx Tires USL Cup, doing so aged 22 years, 70 days old.

- **Miami FC**'s five-goal performance against Sarasota Paradise in the Prinx Tires USL Cup marked the third time the club had recorded at least five goals in official USL competition, and the first since a 7-1 victory against the New York Red Bulls II on September 9, 2022.

- Detroit City FC's **Darren Smith** recorded his 24th goal for Le Rouge in USL competition on Saturday night against Fort Wayne FC in the Prinx Tires USL Cup, making him the club's current leading goalscorer across the USL Championship and USL Cup play after breaking a tie with current teammate **Maxi Rodriguez**.

- New Mexico United's **Joseph Melto** became the third-youngest goalscorer in USL competition for the club as he scored the game-winning goal against El Paso Locomotive FC on Saturday night aged 20 years, 255 days old in the Prinx Tires USL Cup. Only **Alex Waggoner** (18Y, 233D) and **Cristian Nava** (18Y, 264D) have recorded goals at a younger age in USL competition for New Mexico.

- **Phoenix Rising FC** enters Saturday's home contest against Monterey Bay FC with 99 home regular season victories in its history. Rising would become the fifth team to record 100 home wins in the USL Championship regular season with all three points.

- **Colorado Springs Switchbacks FC** and the **Tampa Bay Rowdies** are the first team to go through the group stage of the Prinx Tires USL Cup with a perfect record, with both clubs winning all four of their games following the Switchbacks' win at Orange County SC and the Rowdies' win at home to FC Naples on Saturday.
