TREVOR AMANN SETS CHAMPIONSHIP RECORD WITH FASTEST HAT TRICK

Pittsburgh Riverhounds SC forward **Trevor Amann** set a USL Championship record this past Saturday, recording a hat trick in the span of 3 minutes, 27 seconds against Louisville City FC at F.N.B. Stadium. The sequence broke the record previously held by **Dane Kelly**, who recorded a hat trick in 7 minutes, 17 seconds for Reno 1868 FC against Tacoma Defiance on May 20, 2017.

Amann's three-goal run also surpassed the fastest individual three-goal sequence in the Championship's history, with Brazilian forward **Mauricio Salles** recording three goals in six-plus minutes for VSI Tampa Bay FC as part of his five-goal performance against Antigua Barracuda FC on June 7, 2013. Salles' goals accounted for his second, third and fourth goal of the game, having previously scored earlier in the contest.

PHOENIX RISING FC EARNS 100th HOME REGULAR SEASON VICTORY

Phoenix Rising FC took a 3-2 victory against Monterey Bay FC on Saturday at the Phoenix Rising Soccer Complex, and in turn became the fifth club to record 100 home regular season victories in the USL Championship's history. Rising is now 100-48-44 all-time at home in the USL Championship, averaging 1.79 points per game at home in the league's regular season.

The **Charleston Battery** lead the all-time list with 130 home regular season victories, with **Louisville City FC** (117), **Pittsburgh Riverhounds SC** (109) and **Orange County SC** (107) also having reached the mark.

WORLD CUP HEROES SQUARE OFF IN COLORADO SPRINGS

Colorado Springs Switchbacks FC plays host to Miami FC on Wednesday night at Weidner Field in a contest that will bring together four of the players called up from the USL Championship to represent their countries at the 2026 FIFA World Cup. Colorado Springs' **Duke Lacroix** and **Garven Metusala** were both named to Haiti's squad in the competition, while Miami's **Eloy Room** and **Jürgen Locadia** represented Curacao at the tournament.

Room notably set a World Cup record during the tournament's group stage, posting a 15-save shutout in Curacao's 0-0 draw against Ecuador on June 20 in Kansas City. The result earned the Blue Wave their first point at the World Cup as the country made its debut in the Finals this summer.

SPORTING CLUB JACKSONVILLE CLAIMS FIRST LEAGUE WIN

Sporting Club Jacksonville claimed its first victory in the USL Championship last Wednesday night, rallying to take a 2-1 victory against Pittsburgh Riverhounds SC at Hodges Stadium to break its 15-game winless streak to start the 2026 regular season. Jacksonville's streak ends tied for the third-longest winless run to start a campaign alongside FC Tulsa in the 2018 campaign. Following its 2-2 draw against Brooklyn FC last Saturday night, Sporting JAX is now undefeated in its last three league outings.

Quick Hits

- **Las Vegas Lights FC** earned its first away victory against San Antonio FC in club history on Saturday night with its 2-1 comeback win at Toyota Field. The Lights had previously gone 0-4-2 away at San Antonio. It also marked the first time the side had earned victory after trailing at halftime since August 31, 2024 at Orange County SC.

- **Pittsburgh Riverhounds SC's** victory against Louisville City FC on Saturday afternoon marked its first home win in the series between the clubs, with Louisville having previously gone 12 games undefeated at F.N.B. Stadium across the regular season and playoffs.

- Pittsburgh Riverhounds SC midfielder **Robbie Mertz** recorded his 40th regular season goal contribution for the club with his assist on Trevor Amann's third goal on Saturday afternoon against Louisville City. Mertz has recorded 21 goals and 19 assists in 162 regular season appearances for the Hounds in his career.

- New Mexico United's **Joseph Melto** became the second-youngest player to record a goal and assist in a game for the club in the USL Championship last Wednesday night against Lexington SC, doing so aged 20 years, 259 days old. Only **Cristian Nava** had previously recorded a goal and assist for United at a younger age (18Y, 265D).

- **San Antonio FC's** defeat against Las Vegas Lights FC marked the first time the side had lost after leading at halftime since a 4-2 defeat against New Mexico United on October 20, 2021, breaking a run of 46 games without defeat when leading at halftime.

- Las Vegas Lights FC's **Johnny Rodriguez** recorded his 19th regular season goal for the club as part of its comeback victory against San Antonio FC on Saturday night. With his next goal, Rodriguez would become the 15th player to record 20 goals for two different clubs in the USL Championship's regular season history.

- **New Mexico United's** 4-1 victory against Lexington SC last Wednesday night marked the first time in club history New Mexico had scored four goals away from home in a USL Championship regular season contest.

- **Hartford Athletic** failed to record a shot on target for the first time this season in its 1-0 loss to Rhode Island FC on Saturday night. It marked the first time Hartford had failed to register a shot on target in the USL Championship since July 19, 2025 against Rhode Island FC at Centreville Bank Stadium.
