CHARLESTON BATTERY EARN 200TH REGULAR SEASON VICTORY

The **Charleston Battery** became just the second club to reach 200 regular season victories in the USL Championship era on Saturday night when they took a 1-0 win against Loudoun United FC at Segra Field. The Battery trail only **Louisville City FC** in the all-time rankings, with LouCity currently on 204 regular season wins.

Charleston's victory against Loudoun United also saw the Battery extend its undefeated streak in the series between the teams to 14 games, equaling the longest undefeated run in a head-to-head series in the USL Championship's regular season.

Previously, **Sacramento Republic FC** posted a 14-game undefeated streak against **FC Tulsa** between June 26, 2015 and June 23, 2024 before the Scissortails claimed their first win in the series on March 28, 2025.

DANNY VITIELLO RECORDS 50TH REGULAR SEASON SHUTOUT FOR REPUBLIC FC

Sacramento Republic FC goalkeeper **Danny Vitiello** recorded a four-save shutout in his side's 0-0 draw against Pittsburgh Riverhounds SC on Saturday night at F.N.B. Stadium, marking his 50th regular season shutout in Republic FC's colors. The 30-year-old is the first goalkeeper to record a half-century of clean sheets for one club in the USL Championship's regular season history.

DETROIT SCORES UNIQUE WIN ON ROAD AGAINST FC TULSA

Detroit City FC earned a 1-0 win on the road against FC Tulsa on Saturday night at ONEOK Field as Darren Smith's second-half goal proved the difference for the visitors. Le Rouge's victory came despite the side recording only four touches in the attacking penalty area, only the ninth time on record a club had won in the USL Championship regular season with four or fewer box touches.

NEW MEXICO UNITED'S QUICKFIRE COMEBACK COMES CLOSE TO LEAGUE RECORD

New Mexico United rallied for a 5-2 victory against Monterey Bay FC on Saturday night at Cardinale Stadium as **Valentin Noël** recorded two goals and one assist as the side earned its sixth consecutive win across all competitions. New Mexico scored four goals in the span of 17 minutes – between **Greg Hurst**'s goal in the 74th minute and **Niall Reid-Stephen**'s goal in the 91st minute – which lands just outside the top five for the fastest four-goal sequence in the USL Championship's regular season.

Las Vegas Lights FC holds the all-time mark of four goals in seven minutes against El Paso Locomotive FC on March 23, 2022 at Southwest University Park, when **Cal Jennings** and **Danny Trejo** each scored twice between the 53rd and 60th minutes for the visitors.
