COLORADO SPRINGS SWITCHBACKS FC SETS SINGLE-GAME RECORD FOR SHOTS

Colorado Springs Switchbacks FC set a USL Championship single-game record on Saturday night as it logged 46 shots in its 3-2 victory against Birmingham Legion FC. The total surpassed the prior mark of 41 shots by **Phoenix Rising FC** against Las Vegas Lights FC on May 22, 2021, marking only the second time on record a club had recorded more than 40 shots in a regular season contest.

SACRAMENTO REPUBLIC FC'S KYLE EDWARDS EQUALS GOALS RECORD FOR SUBSTITUTE

Sacramento Republic FC forward **Kyle Edwards** scored the game-winner in his side's 1-0 win against Lexington SC on Saturday night, and in turn equaled the USL Championship record for the most goals by a substitute in the league's regular season history. Edwards' goal was his 18th coming off the bench in the Championship's regular season, drawing him level with two-time USL Championship All-League selection **Lucky Mkosana** and Cuban forward **Heviel Cordovés**.

HARTFORD ATHLETIC CONTINUES UNDEFEATED STREAK IN USL CUP

Hartford Athletic earned a 4-2 victory against the Charlotte Independence in the Quarterfinals of the 2026 Prinx Tires USL Cup last Wednesday night, advancing the defending titleholders to a Semifinal against **Colorado Springs Switchbacks FC** on Tuesday, Sept. 8 at Trinity Health Stadium.

Hartford remains undefeated in its history in the competition, with its 12-game streak (9-0-3) having previously surpassed inaugural title-winner Northern Colorado Hailstorm FC 10-game run (7-0-3) in the tournament's history. Hartford's victory against the Independence brought Charlotte's undefeated streak to an end at eight games, while the Switchbacks will enter the Semifinal between the clubs on a seven-game undefeated streak in the competition.

OAKLAND ROOTS SC'S KENDALL McINTOSH SURPASSES 400 REGULAR SEASON SAVES

Oakland Roots SC goalkeeper **Kendall McIntosh** notched a two-save performance in his side's 1-1 draw against Monterey Bay FC, and in turn became only the sixth goalkeeper to record at least 400 saves in the USL Championship's regular season.

The 32-year-old reached the mark in his 117th appearance in the league and has averaged 3.47 saves per 90 minutes over his career. That rate ranks first among goalkeepers with at least 400 saves, with 2015 Goalkeeper of the Year **Brandon Miller** having averaged 3.11 saves per 90 minutes during his career to rank second.

SACRAMENTO REPUBLIC FC'S CAL JENNINGS AIMS TO ADD TO PROLIFIC CAREER

Sacramento Republic FC announced last Friday the signing of forward **Cal Jennings**, who returns to the USL Championship as one of the most prolific scorers in league history. The 29-year-old ranks third in both regular season goals (82) and strike rate, with his mark of a goal every 134.9 minutes ranking third among players with at least 40 regular season goals in league history.

- Las Vegas Lights FC defender **Aarón Guillén** moved into the top 10 in regular season minutes in USL Championship history as he went the full 90 minutes in his side's 2-1 win against Brooklyn FC. Guillén has now logged 21,774 minutes in the Championship's regular season for his career.

- Tampa Bay Rowdies defender **Conner Antley** scored his first goal in the USL Championship on Saturday night against Rhode Island FC, with the tally coming in his 105th regular season appearance. Antley had previously recorded 12 regular season assists.

- Las Vegas Lights FC's **Manuel Arteaga** recorded his 75th regular season goal contribution in the USL Championship on Saturday night, providing the assist on **Oalex Anderson's** goal against Brooklyn FC. Arteaga has recorded 57 goals and 18 assists in 167 regular season appearances in the league.

- Louisville City FC's **Ray Serrano** recorded his second two-goal game in the USL Championship all-time in LouCity's 3-2 win against Orange County SC, moving to 21 regular-season goals for LouCity overall. Serrano is the third player to record at least 20 goals and 20 assists for Louisville, joining **Brian Ownby** (24G, 33A) and **Niall McCabe** (20G, 30A), and the 13th player to do so for a single club league-wide.

- **Las Vegas Lights FC's** 2-1 victory against Brooklyn FC on Saturday night at Cashman Field marked the first time the Lights had rallied at home to win from a halftime deficit since a 3-1 victory against Oakland Roots SC on September 9, 2023.

- The **Tampa Bay Rowdies** extended their winning streak to four games with a 2-0 win against Rhode Island FC on Saturday night at Al Lang Stadium. The Rowdies have now recorded 149 regular season wins since joining the USL Championship in 2017 as they head to face Detroit City FC on Saturday night at Keyworth Stadium.

- **New Mexico United** extended its winning streak to a club-record six games with a 1-0 victory against FC Tulsa on Saturday night at Isotopes Park. The result also marked New Mexico's 99th regular season win in the USL Championship as it heads to face Loudoun United FC on Saturday night.

- Miami FC's **Gerald Díaz** recorded the shortest on-field time before receiving a red card in the Prinx Tires USL Cup's history, being sent off for violent conduct 4 minutes and 5 seconds after being brought on as a substitute against San Antonio FC last Wednesday night.
