NEW MEXICO UNITED'S KRIS SHAKES PUTS ON SHOW IN LOUDOUN

New Mexico United goalkeeper **Kris Shakes** equaled a club record on Saturday night in his side's scoreless draw against Loudoun United FC, posting a nine-save shutout at Segra Field to match his predecessor **Alex Tambakis** for the most saves for New Mexico in a USL Championship contest.

Per Opta, Shakes' performance saw him log a -1.9 Goals Prevented mark in the contest, which ranks as the fourth highest single-game mark in the USL Championship this season. Hartford Athletic's **Antony Siah** recorded a -2.88 Goals Prevented mark in his side's 1-1 draw against Brooklyn FC on March 20 as he recorded a 10-save display at Maimonides Park.

CHARLESTON BATTERY MOVE TO VERGE OF TOP FIVE HOME UNDEFEATED STREAKS

The **Charleston Battery** took a 5-0 victory against Miami FC on Monday night in a contest rescheduled from Saturday at Patriots Point to extend the club's home regular season undefeated streak to 24 games. Charleston's streak is now tied for the sixth-longest home undefeated streak in USL Championship history, nine games from the 33-game streak recorded by the **Richmond Kickers** across the 2012-14 seasons.

Over the course of the Battery's current run, the side has posted a 20-0-4 record and outscored its opponents 71-19, an average of 2.96 goals per game, and has recorded at least four goals on 10 occasions.

PHOENIX RISING'S IHSAN SACKO BRACES SELF FOR REPUBLIC FC

Phoenix Rising FC forward **Ihsan Sacko** recorded his second two-goal performance against Sacramento Republic FC this season on Saturday night, earning his side a 2-2 draw at Heart Health Park. The French forward has now scored five goals in five appearances all-time against Republic FC, averaging a goal every 71.8 minutes against Rising's longtime rival.

That mark ranks third among active players who have scored at least five goals against a current opponent in the USL Championship. Detroit City FC's **Darren Smith**'s five-goal haul against Sporting Club Jacksonville places him at the top of the list, with the Charleston Battery's **Wilmer Cabrera** ranking second for his career performances against New Mexico United.

RHODE ISLAND'S JJ WILLIAMS HEADS TO SCOTLAND AS LEAGUE'S DOMINANT AERIAL FORCE

Rhode Island FC announced on Tuesday the transfer of JJ Williams to Heart of Midlothian of the Scottish Premiership for a club-record fee, with Williams departing the USL Championship as the most dominant aerial forward the league has seen over the past decade.

Since the USL's partnership with Opta in 2017, Williams recorded the most headed goals (23), headed shots (123) and headed Expected Goals (16.52xG) of any player in the Championship across the regular season and playoffs. His 23 headed goals accounted for 36.5% of his 63 goals in the Championship's regular season and playoffs.

EL PASO LOCOMOTIVE EXTENDS SHUTOUT STREAK TO FOUR GAMES

El Paso Locomotive FC posted its fourth consecutive shutout in the USL Championship regular season on Saturday night with a 1-0 win at Colorado Springs Switchbacks FC as goalkeeper **Pedro Cruz** recorded a five-save performance at Weidner Field. Locomotive is the fourth team to record four consecutive shutouts in the Championship this season, and carries a 389-minute shutout streak overall into its contest on Wednesday night against Pittsburgh Riverhounds SC.

- Charleston Battery Head Coach **Ben Pirmann** is set to coach his 200th game in the USL Championship across the regular season and playoffs on Saturday against Las Vegas Lights FC. Pirmann has posted a 108-50-41 record in his career in the Championship to date.
