HOW UNIQUE WAS THE TAMPA BAY ROWDIES' COMEBACK?

The **Tampa Bay Rowdies** rallied for a 5-4 victory against **Louisville City FC** on Saturday night, overcoming a three-goal deficit and scoring five times in the second half to claim victory at Al Lang Stadium. It marked the third time in the Rowdies' history that the club had scored five goals in the second half of a game, the most of any team in the USL Championship era and marked the 47th time a team had scored at least five times in a comeback victory on record.

The contest, however, marked just the eighth time that a side had rallied for victory while scoring at least five goals in just the second half, with **Pittsburgh Riverhounds SC**'s 6-5 victory against the Harrisburg City Islanders on May 30, 2015 – now dubbed the Miracle on the Mon – the lone instance in which a side scored six times in the second half to rally for victory. The Hounds recorded three goals from the 90th minute on to turn a two-goal deficit into victory, while in 2024 the **Charleston Battery** scored three goals from the 92nd minute on to earn a 5-2 victory against North Carolina FC at Patriots Point.

Tampa Bay's two goals in the 86th minute by **Russell Cicerone** and 89th minute by **MD Myers**, therefore, make it the third-latest comeback in league history by a side recording at least five second-half goals all-time.

SACRAMENTO REPUBLIC FC'S MEMO RODRÍGUEZ NOTCHES HAT TRICK OF ASSISTS

Sacramento Republic FC midfielder **Memo Rodríguez** became the 29th player to record three assists in a USL Championship regular season game on Saturday night as the side took a 5-0 victory against Sporting Club Jacksonville, providing all three helpers on Sacramento's sequence of three goals in five minutes between the 38th and 43rd minute at Heart Health Park.

Rodríguez is the second Republic FC player to record three assists in a game in the USL Championship, following **Max Alvarez**, who accomplished the feat against Orange County SC on August 17, 2014 in the club's inaugural season. Rodríguez and teammate **Tyler Wolff**, who became the sixth Sacramento player to notch a hat trick in USL Championship history, also became the seventh pair of teammates to notch three goals and three assists in the same game, and the second in Republic FC history after Alvarez and **Tommy Stewart**.

TAMPA BAY ROWDIES, LOUISVILLE CITY SET SINGLE-GAME RECORD FOR LONG-RANGE GOALS

The **Tampa Bay Rowdies** and **Louisville City FC** produced one of the greatest games in USL Championship on Saturday night at Al Lang Stadium, and in the process set a regular season single-game record with five combined goals from beyond the penalty area as both Tampa Bay's Russell Cicerone and Louisville City's Jake Morris struck twice from outside the box.

The Rowdies and LouCity surpassed four games which had seen four goals from outside the box previously in the Championship regular season, most recently in the 3-3 draw between **San Antonio FC** and **Colorado Springs Switchbacks FC** on May 2 earlier this season.

OAKLAND ROOTS SC SUFFERS PASSING TRAP IN DEFEAT TO HOUNDS

Oakland Roots SC recorded the second-most passes in a USL Championship regular season on Saturday night, logging 779 passes and completing 685, in its 1-0 loss to **Pittsburgh Riverhounds SC** at the Oakland Alameda-Coliseum. Only **Atlanta United 2** has previously recorded more passes in a USL Championship regular season contest, logging 792 in a 3-0 loss against the **Charleston Battery** on April 25, 2018.

Oakland became the latest team to fail to take victory when recording more than 700 passes in a regular season contest, with only **Sporting Kansas City II** having emerged victorious in a 1-0 victory against **Colorado Springs Switchbacks FC** on April 4, 2018 of the six teams to surpass the mark, and sides going 1-3-2 overall.

NEW MEXICO UNITED MAINTAINS UPPER HAND ON SWITCHBACKS AT ISOTOPES PARK

New Mexico United maintained its undefeated record at home against **Colorado Springs Switchbacks FC** on Saturday night with a 1-0 win at Isotopes Park as Maliek Howell's goal proved the difference between the sides. New Mexico is now undefeated in nine regular season games at home against the Switchbacks, tied for the third-most contests without a loss in a series in the Championship's history.

Isotopes Park isn't the only unhappy hunting ground for the Switchbacks in their history. The side has also gone winless in 11 visits to San Antonio FC's Toyota Field all-time, with the sides having played to a 3-3 draw in their most recent encounter there on May 2.

Quick Hits

- The Charleston Battery's **Wilmer Cabrera** scored the fastest goal in the USL Championship this season after 21 seconds against Brooklyn FC on Saturday night. The goal also marked the fastest goal by the Battery in the USL Championship era.
- Loudoun United FC forward **Abdellatif Aboukoura** equaled the club's regular season goalscoring record with his 25th goal for the team on Saturday night against Hartford Athletic, moving into a tie with former teammate Zach Ryan.
- Detroit City FC midfielder **Maxi Rodriguez** recorded his 25th regular season goal in the USL Championship for the club on Saturday night against Miami FC. Rodriguez is the first player to reach the mark for Le Rouge, doing so in his 110th appearance.
- The Tampa Bay Rowdies' **Russell Cicerone** reached 75 regular season goals in his USL Championship career with his two-goal performance against Louisville City FC on Saturday night. Cicerone is the ninth player to reach 75 regular season goals in the league's history, and now one of only two players to have recorded at least 75 goals and 30 assists in league history alongside **Enzo Martínez** (78G, 53A).
- The **Charleston Battery**'s 5-0 victory against Brooklyn FC extended the club's home regular season undefeated streak to 23 games, five games shy of the club's 28-game home undefeated streak from May 24, 2014, to May 28, 2016.
- **Lexington SC**'s 3-2 victory against Monterey Bay FC on Saturday night marked the second time the club had rallied from a two-goal deficit to take victory in its professional history, having previously claimed a 4-3 victory against Northern Colorado Hailstorm in USL League One on August 5, 2023.
- Sacramento Republic FC Head Coach **Neill Collins** recorded his 114th victory in the USL Championship with his side's 5-0 win against Sporting Club Jacksonville on Saturday night, moving him into sole possession of third place among the league's winningest coaches.
- Louisville City FC's **Kevon Lambert** marked his 200th regular season appearance with a two-goal performance against Birmingham Legion FC last Wednesday night. The brace was the first of the Jamaican international's career in the league, moving him to 21 regular season goals overall.
- San Antonio FC's **Cristian Parano** recorded a two-goal game against Indy Eleven last Friday night at Toyota Field, marking his first two-goal game in the USL Championship since August 25, 2019 against New Mexico United.
- The **Charleston Battery**'s victory against Brooklyn FC was the club's 199th in the USL Championship regular season. The Battery would become the second team to reach 200 wins after Louisville City FC with its next regular season win.

- Sacramento Republic FC goalkeeper **Danny Vitiello** recorded his 49th regular season shutout for the club against Brooklyn FC on Saturday night. Vitiello would become the first goalkeeper to record 50 regular-season shutouts for one club with his next clean sheet for Republic FC.

- Indy Eleven Head Coach **Sean McAuley** will mark his 100th game at the helm for the club on Sunday evening when it hosts Hartford Athletic. McAuley will become the first manager to reach the century mark in club history, with **Martin Rennie** having logged 99 games at the helm between Jan. 16, 2018 and June 16, 2021.
