TAMPA BAY ROWDIES ENTER WEEKEND WITH POSTSEASON BERTH IN SIGHT

The Tampa Bay Rowdies could become the first team to clinch a place in the 2026 USL Championship Playoffs on Saturday night with a victory at home against Brooklyn FC earning the club its return to the postseason. The Rowdies could also clinch with a draw, depending on results elsewhere.

LOUDOUN UNITED'S ABDELLATIF ABOUKOURA EQUALS U-22 SCORING RECORD

Loudoun United FC attacking midfielder **Abdellatif Aboukoura** recorded his fifth goal of the current campaign on Saturday night, scoring a first-half tally against El Paso Locomotive FC at Southwest University Park. In doing so, the 2025 USL Championship Young Player of the Year recorded his 26th regular season goal in the league, equaling the mark for the most goals by a player before turning 22 years of age in league history.

Aboukoura is now level with current Orange County SC forward **Ethan Zubak** and former LA Galaxy II forward **Jack McBean**, both of whom accomplished the feat early in their careers with Los Dos. Aboukoura turns 22 on October 16, and will get his first chance to break the tie and become the league record-holder individually on Friday night at home to Colorado Springs Switchbacks FC.

BIRMINGHAM LEGION'S ROMARIO WILLIAMS REACHES 70-GOAL LANDMARK

Birmingham Legion FC forward **Romario Williams** recorded a two-goal performance in his side's visit to Hartford Athletic on Saturday night and in turn reached 70 regular season goals for his career in the USL Championship.

The Jamaican international reached the landmark in his 188th regular season game and is the 12th player to reach the mark in the USL Championship's history. Williams' strike-rate of a goal every 166 minutes ranks fifth among the 12 players to have recorded at least 70 goals in the league's history.

CHARLESTON BATTERY'S BEN PIRMAN REACHES 200 GAMES ON SIDELINES

Charleston Battery Head Coach **Ben Pirmann** recorded his 200th game on the sidelines across the USL Championship's regular season and playoffs on Saturday night as his side took a 2-0 victory against Las Vegas Lights FC, becoming the ninth manager to record at least 200 games on the sidelines in the league's history.

Among the coaches to have recorded at least 200 games, Pirmann's record of 109-50-41 has seen him log the highest points-per-game mark in the cohort, averaging 1.84ppg across his tenures at **Memphis 901 FC** and the Battery.

EL PASO LOCOMOTIVE FC'S RUBIO RUBÍN SURGES PAST 20-GOAL MARK IN REGULAR SEASON

El Paso Locomotive FC forward **Rubio Rubín** recorded the second hat trick in the club's USL Championship history on Saturday night to lead Locomotive to its sixth consecutive league win with a 4-1 victory against Loudoun United FC. In doing so, the Guatemala international reached 22 regular season goals in his 42nd regular season appearance in the league overall.

Competing previously for San Diego Loyal SC and the Charleston Battery, Rubín's strike rate of a goal every 126.1 minutes currently ranks fourth among players with at least 20 regular season goals in the USL Championship. With 13 regular season goals this year, he is now three goals from equaling Locomotive's single-season record of 16 goals by Luis Solignac in the 2022 campaign.

- **Hartford Athletic's** 3-2 victory against Birmingham Legion FC on Saturday night marked the club's first win after trailing by two goals in the USL Championship regular season since a 3-2 win against Loudoun United FC on October 13, 2021.
- **El Paso Locomotive FC** extended its winning streak to six games with victories against Pittsburgh Riverhounds SC and Loudoun United FC in Week 26. Locomotive is one win from equaling the longest winning streak in club history in the 2023 regular season.
- **New Mexico United** earned its 100th victory in the USL Championship regular season last Wednesday night with its 2-1 win against Lexington SC. New Mexico is the 14th club to record 100 regular season wins in the league's history, and has posted an overall record of 100-73-60, averaging 1.54 points-per-game.
- Charleston Battery forward **Maalique Foster** recorded a two-goal performance against Las Vegas Lights FC on Saturday night to move to 50 goal contributions in the USL Championship regular season for his career. Foster has logged 31 goals and 19 assists in 157 appearances in the league.
- **Brooklyn FC's** 4-1 victory against Sporting Club Jacksonville on Saturday night marked the first four-goal game for the club in the USL Championship, while **Peter Mangione** recorded the first two-goal game in the USL Championship for the club in the win.
- **Louisville City FC's** 0-0 draw against Detroit City FC marked the fourth time this season LouCity was held scoreless at home in the Championship, the most in club history. Previously, LouCity had been held scoreless at home on three occasions in the 2015, 2017, 2018 and 2019 seasons.
